Why join or form a renters union?

By coming together, we:

- Have a stronger voice to government
- Have more power to fight for renters rights
- Have more protection and security

What is a renters union?

Renters' unions are building, neighbourhood or city-based organisations made up of and led by renters themselves to fight for our collective interests and rights.

Who is a renters union for?

A renters' union is for:

- Tenants whose landlords neglect repairs
- Tenants whose landlords are overcharging on rent
- Tenants whose landlords disregard tenants' rights
- Tenants who wish to stand in solidarity with and protect their neighbours
- Anybody who believes that a home should be accessible to everyone, not just those with money.

How does a renters union organise?

Building-based renters unions are generally made up of tenants who live in the same building and/or have the same landlord. Neighbourhood and city-based unions are networks of tenants who often have similar issues and stand in solidarity with each other, but may live in different buildings or have different landlords.
